Tucker Frawley

Director of Defense, Baserunning & Gameplay New York Mets

Tucker Frawley is the New York Mets' Director of Defense, Baserunning & Gameplay. In this role, Tucker oversees the processes by which players are trained on defense and on the bases. This includes oversight of defensive player plans and instruction at each of the Mets' affiliates.

Prior to being hired by the Mets, Tucker was with the Minnesota Twins, where he had been since the start of the 2020 season. He was initially hired as their Assistant Field Coordinator, and his role grew to include oversight of both catching and infield instruction.

Prior to working for the Twins, Tucker spent 12 seasons as a coach at Yale University, the final eight years as Associate Head Coach.

Tucker played collegiately at the College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, MA, and was the program's all-time hits leader when he graduated in 2006. He played in the CanAm League (2006) and Frontier League (2007), before beginning his coaching career at Yale in the fall of 2007.
